# Economic Indicators

## Summary

The Annual Trends report summarizes and illustrates the characteristics of the Cheyenne and Laramie County economy over the last ten years or longer. This report presents the latest available federal, state, and local agency statistics on Laramie County's economic and demographic growth patterns. Both business and government planning require a realistic and unbiased assessment of past trends and future directions. The indicators and statistics presented in this report are intended to be used as a guide to understanding the local economy.

## 2023 in Review

At this time last year, Wyoming and Laramie County were dealing with high inflation. In 2023, inflation started coming down, largely driven by higher interest rates. The high interest rates have cooled off several sectors, including housing and banking.

A key indicator of the level of general business activity is sales and in Laramie County both total taxable sales and total retail sales rose in 2023. Total taxable sales rose 10.0 percent from 2022 to 2023. Total retail sales rose by 1.6 percent during this same time period. This resulted in an increase in sales and use tax receipts of 10.0 percent from 2022 to 2023. The tax receipts are the highest levels recorded in Laramie County, eclipsing 75 million dollars in 2023.

There was an uptick in oil activity in the county over the last year. From 2022 to 2023, total annual oil production rose by 8.5 percent, the average monthly number of active wells rose 6.6 percent, and the number of spuds – defined as a newly drilled oil well – rose from 49 to 56. Oil prices fell nearly \$17/barrel on average during 2023.

Laramie County gained jobs from 2022 to 2023, according to both Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) and Current Employment Statistics (CES)<sup>1</sup>. Laramie County gained 402 jobs according to the LAUS and 117 jobs according to the CES. Employment data from the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) lag one year, but provide greater detail of employment and earnings by industry. These data show government remained the primary employer in Laramie County in 2023, accounting for 21.7 percent of all jobs and 36.7 percent of all earnings by place of work. This significant public sector employment continued to serve as an important source of local economic stability.

Unemployment fell in Laramie County and across Wyoming. In Laramie County, it fell from 3.3 percent in 2022 to 3.1 percent in 2023. In Wyoming, it fell from 3.6 percent in 2022 to 3.1 percent in 2023. The

The LAUS data indicated that more Laramie County residents were working. The CES data reflect a count of **jobs** not workers and showed an increase in the number of jobs in the county.

annual unemployment rate is the lowest recorded for Laramie County since 1985 when we began tracking the statistic.

The housing market cooled last year due to increasing borrowing rates. The average number of houses for sale in the city(+24.3%) and in the county(+48.2%). However, the total number of units sold – city and county – fell from 1,579 in 2022 to 1,264 in 2023(-19.9%). In the city, the average selling price rose from \$362,147 to \$372,305 (+2.8%). In the county, the average selling price fell from \$578,303 to \$575,456 (-0.5%). It's the first time since 2008 that housing prices dipped in rural Laramie County.

The number of building permits issued is an indicator of future home construction. In the city, the number of building permits for new single-family homes fell sharply from 212 in 2022 to 67 in 2023 (-68%), but new apartments/duplexes rose from 49 in 2022 to 73 in 2023 (+49%). The increase in multi-family projects led to 141 housing units being added to Cheyenne. That is the lowest number of housing units added in a given year in the last 30 years. In the county, outside the city of Cheyenne, the number of single-family building permits also fell sharply – from 160 in 2022 to 85 in 2023 (-47%).

The value of new industrial/commercial construction rose in the city and fell in the county in 2023. Total new dollar valuation was \$50,865,494 in the city and \$23,004,109 in the county. In the city, the Eagle Claw Tackle factory and a senior activity center were the biggest new projects. In the county, a new building for MHC Kenworth was the largest new construction project.

Laramie County's population shrank 0.1 percent in 2022(-71 people), while the city of Cheyenne saw its population decrease 0.7 percent(-425 people). This reflects the lack of affordable housing in Cheyenne, forcing newcomers to move outside of the city limits and/or forgo living in Laramie County altogether.

Looking to the future, the most pressing economic issue is inflation. We are seeing the highest rates of inflation since the 1980s and interest rates are slowly, but surely, rising. As borrowing becomes more expensive, we should see inflation rates come down, but housing will become less affordable. This is a major issue with the Sentinel Project coming to town in the next few years.

The following six sections of the Annual Economic Trends report provide comprehensive data on business, employment, wages and income, demographics, housing and development trends for Greater Cheyenne.

## Business Trends

The Business Trends section contains primary business data sets designed to measure overall economic performance in the Greater Cheyenne economy.

- Table 1.4 contains ten primary growth measures including: population, jobs, personal income and Gross Domestic Product (GDP). The Current Employment Statistics (CES) five-year average job growth rate is 0.39 percent and the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) employment five-year average growth rate is 1.91 percent. Due to the coronavirus pandemic, these five-year averages were pushed down and are not necessarily reflective of normal economic conditions.
- Figure 3 shows the relationship between growth rates in real GDP, personal income and wages in Laramie County. Real GDP is the inflation adjusted value of all the final goods and services produced in the economy in a year. Over time the growth rates in real GDP, personal income, and wages tend to move in the same direction. In 2022, we saw wages hold steady while personal income and real GDP growth rates dropped off from 2021.
- Table 1.1 provides total estimated taxable sales and retail sales. Total taxable sales increased 10.0 percent from 2022 to 2023. Total retail sales increased 1.6 percent during this same time period. 9 of the 14 major sectors saw an increase in sales, despite inflation reaching every sector. Electronics and Appliance Stores saw the largest increase in sales, improving by over 13 percent over 2022's figures.
- Table 1.2 presents data on sales and use tax receipts to entities within Laramie County. Total sales and use tax receipts increased 10.0 percent from 2022 to 2023. The overall tax receipts are the highest recorded and eclipsed 75 million dollars.
- Table 1.9 (a) shows annual Laramie County oil production and the number of active wells. Average monthly oil production in Laramie County rose from 703,753 barrels in 2022 to 763,777 barrels in 2023. Total annual oil production rose 8.5 percent from 2022 to 2023. The average monthly number of active wells rose from 488 in 2022 to 520 in 2023(+6.6%). Table 1.9 (b) shows oil prices, which fell sharply from a monthly average of \$94.79 in 2022 to \$77.64 in 2023(-18.1%). The number of spuds – defined as a newly drilled oil well – rose from 49 in 2022 to 56 in 2023.

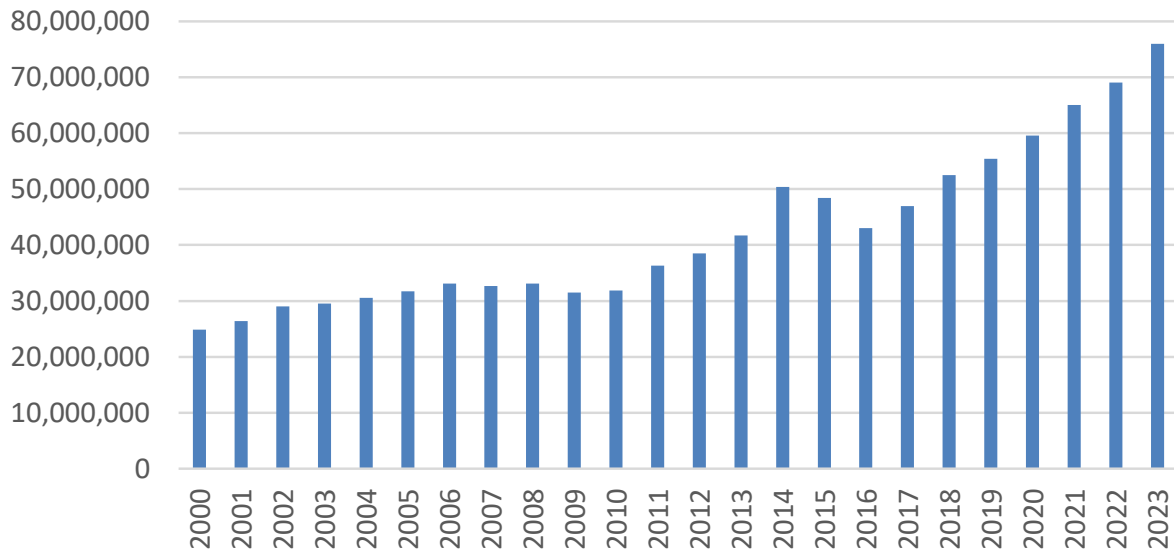

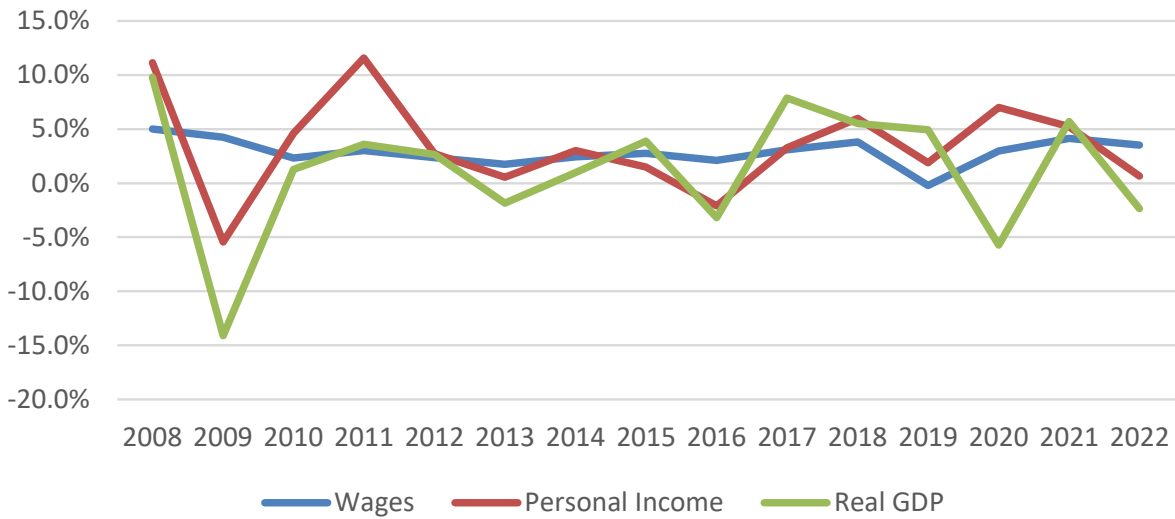

## Employment Trends

This Employment Trends section presents a comprehensive overview of past and current employment statistics and trends.

Table 2.1 presents job totals, (these totals include both full- and part-time jobs), by industrial sector. This allows for the measurement of job growth, by sector, over time. The source of these data is the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) which is part of the U.S. Department of Commerce and is considered the best source of jobs data<sup>2</sup>. BEA data generally lag by at least one year, so the most current data for this report are 2022.

- The total number of jobs in Laramie County in 2022 was 81,027. That is an increase of 2,449 jobs since 2021.
- Employment data for the Mining sector is available for years 2013 through 2022. The mining sector added 116 jobs in 2022. The industries that added the most jobs were finance and insurance(+1,384), real estate and rental leasing(+557), and accommodation and food services(+290).
- Government remained the primary employer in Laramie County with a total of 17,318 jobs. This was a decrease of 215 jobs (-1.2%) from 2021 to 2022. The importance of the public sector to the Laramie County economy is clear. In 2022, government on all levels, federal, state, and local, accounted for 21.7 percent of all jobs and 36.7 percent of all income. This significant public sector presence is a source of economic stability in Laramie County. However, both federal and state government employment fell in 2022.
- Unemployment fell in Wyoming and Laramie County during 2023. The unemployment rate in the state moved from 3.6 percent in 2022 to 3.1 percent in 2023. During the same time period, unemployment in Laramie County moved from 3.3 percent in 2022 to 3.1 percent in 2023. 3.1 percent is the lowest annual unemployment rate for Laramie County since we began tracking the statistic in 1985.

<sup>2</sup>BEA data are based on Current Employment Statistics, Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages and Internal Revenue Service data and include full- and part-time employees, civilian government employees, agricultural and household employees, estimates/adjustments for employment not covered by the state Unemployment Insurance program and the Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees program, and estimates for employment in farms, religious organizations, railroads, military and residents employed by international organizations.

- Table 2.3 presents BEA data on the number of non-farm and farm proprietors, plus average incomes for both groups through 2022. From 2021 to 2022, the number of non-farm proprietors increased by 2,588 (+10.4%) while the number of farm proprietors decreased by 25(-2.4%). Average farm incomes fell from 2021 to 2022, from \$14,140 to \$9,853. It should be noted that there is substantial variation in the data. Annual averages for farm income over the past 10 years have ranged from an average loss of -\$10,072 in 2020 to a high of \$18,125 in 2014.
- Table 2.4 contains job projections from 2021 to 2025 using BEA employment data as the baseline. This table also contains actual jobs data for 2021 and 2022, which allows for a comparison between actual and projected results. For 2021, the total employment projection was 69,543. This projection was an underestimate – it projected 5,481 fewer jobs than were actually counted in that year. The 2022 projection of 75,220 total jobs was also an underestimate. The actual number of jobs was 81,027, 5,807 fewer jobs than projected. The estimations were off for a few reasons. First, the initial data for 2020 indicated job losses due to the pandemic, which were included for 2021 and 2022 projections, pushing the estimations down. Second, there was a bubble created in the housing market, leading to much higher than expected employment in FIRE(Finance, Insurance, and Real Estate).
- In Table 2.4, the projections for 2023 and 2024 have been revised, and projections for 2025 have been added. Projections are made by extrapolating past trends into the future. Given the current instability/volatility in the Wyoming economy and the national economic issue of inflation and rising interest rates, these forecasts should be viewed with caution.
- Table 2.5 shows the distribution of employers in Laramie County by the number of employees. These data are published by the U.S. Census Bureau as part of the County Business Patterns, a program designed to provide statistics for businesses with paid employees. While data are generally available 18 months after each reference year, the most current available data for Laramie County are 2021. The vast majority of employers in Laramie County are small businesses. In 2021, more than three-fourths of businesses with paid employees had fewer than 10 employees. More than half (62.7%) employed fewer than five employees and 16.2 percent employed five to nine employees. Less than one percent of businesses with paid employees employed more than 100 workers.

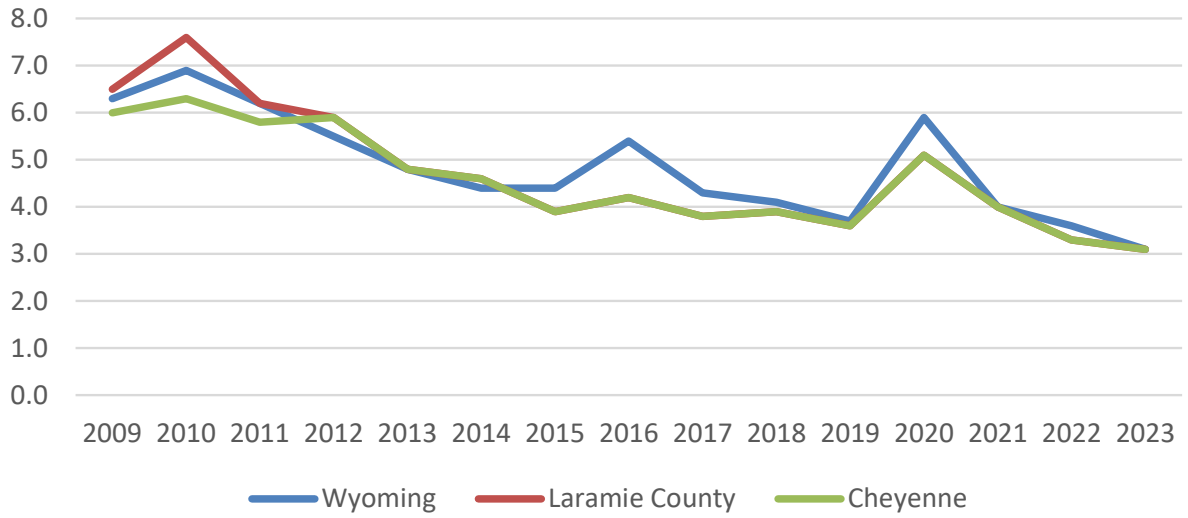

## Wages, Earnings & Income Trends

The Wages, Earnings and Income Trends section presents data series on average wages, earnings, and personal income for residents of Laramie County. The most recent income data available are for 2022. The U.S. Census Bureau provides various income measures using the American Community Survey (ACS). The ACS provides 1-year and 5-year estimates. The 1-year estimate is available for geographic areas with 65,000+ persons. The 5-year estimates are available for the 1-year areas and those with less than 65,000 persons. The 5-year estimates, while not as timely, are based on 5 times as many sample cases as 1-year estimates.<sup>3</sup>

The key thing to note about the 1-year and 5-year estimates is that they should NOT be compared with each other. Comparisons may be made from 1-year estimate to 1-year estimate and from 5-year estimate to 5-year estimate (as long as they are not overlapping). However, accurate comparisons cannot be made between the data series. For example, it is not statistically appropriate to compare 1-year estimates to 5-year estimates.

- Income figures will vary depending upon which estimate is used. The ACS income estimates are published at the 90 percent confidence level; the end result is that reported income measures can vary widely from year-to-year in both absolute size and in the rates of change. **Please use extreme caution when drawing definitive conclusions about income measures.** The footnotes in Table 3.0 identify which of the estimates are being used.
- Table 3.0 (a) presents ACS 5-year estimates of household income in Laramie County. In 2022, median household income was \$76,282 and average (mean) household income was \$97,662. The mean is the arithmetic average of a set of numbers. The mean is particularly sensitive to outliers – numbers that are significantly larger or smaller than the rest of the numbers in the set. In this case, Laramie County’s mean income is much higher than the median income because of the effect of high-income households.
- Table 3.0(c) shows Earnings by Gender. Median earnings for males in 2022 were \$61,033 and \$46,376 for females. Male median earnings were 31.6 percent higher than female median earnings. Mean earnings for males were \$73,354 and mean earnings for females were \$55,212. Male mean (average) earnings were 32.8 percent higher than female mean earnings. This large wage gap in

Laramie County is consistent with the State of Wyoming's persistent wage gap. In 2022, Wyoming had the second largest wage gap among the 50 states and Washington D.C., trailing only Utah. A woman in Wyoming made 64.2 cents for every dollar a man made.<sup>4</sup>In Utah, women made just 60.1 cents for every dollar a man made. In Washington D.C., the area with the smallest disparity, women made 87.1 cents for every dollar a man made.

- Figure 7 shows the percentage changes in growth in annual personal income for the United States, the State of Wyoming, and Laramie County. Fluctuations in Laramie County's personal income closely mirror both national and state income changes most years. The magnitude of changes in both state and local personal income is greater than those on a national level in some years. This difference is a function of the State of Wyoming's dependence on the volatile mineral industry. Comparing the fluctuations in personal income at the state level and in Laramie County shows annual changes are greater at the state level relative to the county, providing evidence that Laramie County's economy is more stable than that of the state.
- Table 3.1 presents data on Average Annual Earned Income by sector in Laramie County in 2022. Average annual earned income across all sectors rose from \$53,027 to \$55,627 (+4.9%) from 2021 to 2022. The three sectors with the highest average annual earned incomes were Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$104,494), Utilities (\$100,529), and Mining (\$96,824). The three sectors with the highest growth in wages were Accommodation and Food Services(+25.0%), Administrative and Waste Management Services(+13.9%), and Information(+12.8%).
- Despite rising in 2022, per capita personal income in Laramie County continued lagging behind the national average. In 2022, per capita personal income in the county was \$59,148 and the national per capita income was \$65,470. 2022 marks the seventh year in a row that Laramie County per capita income has lagged behind the national average. The percentage point gap(-9.7%) is the widest recorded in the last 30 years. At the state level, per capita personal income is higher than the national average. Per capita income in 2022 for the state of Wyoming was \$73,248, 11.8 percent higher than the national average. These data are shown in Table 3.2.

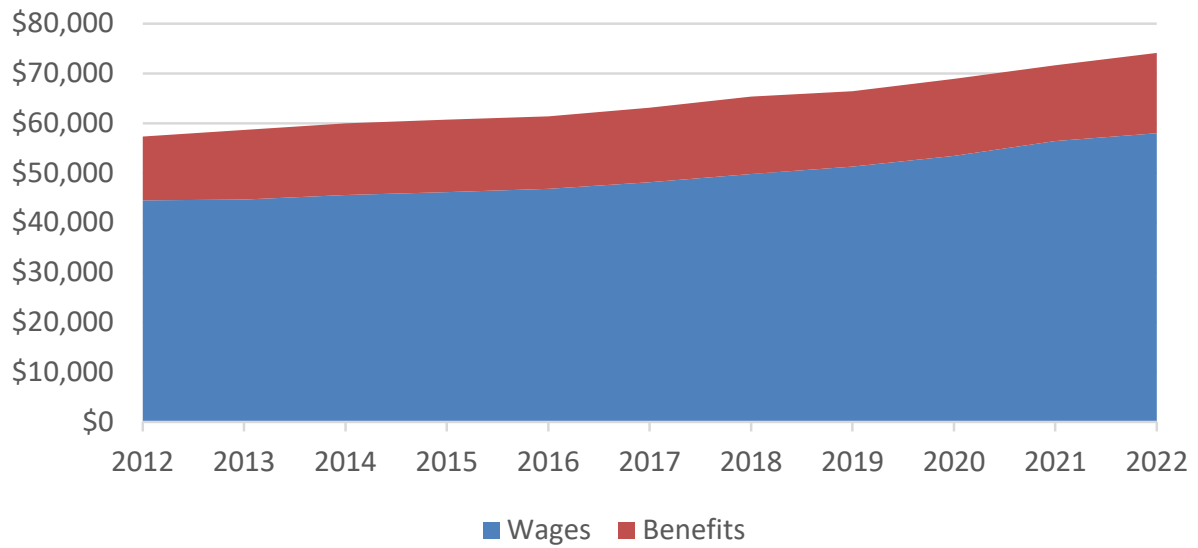

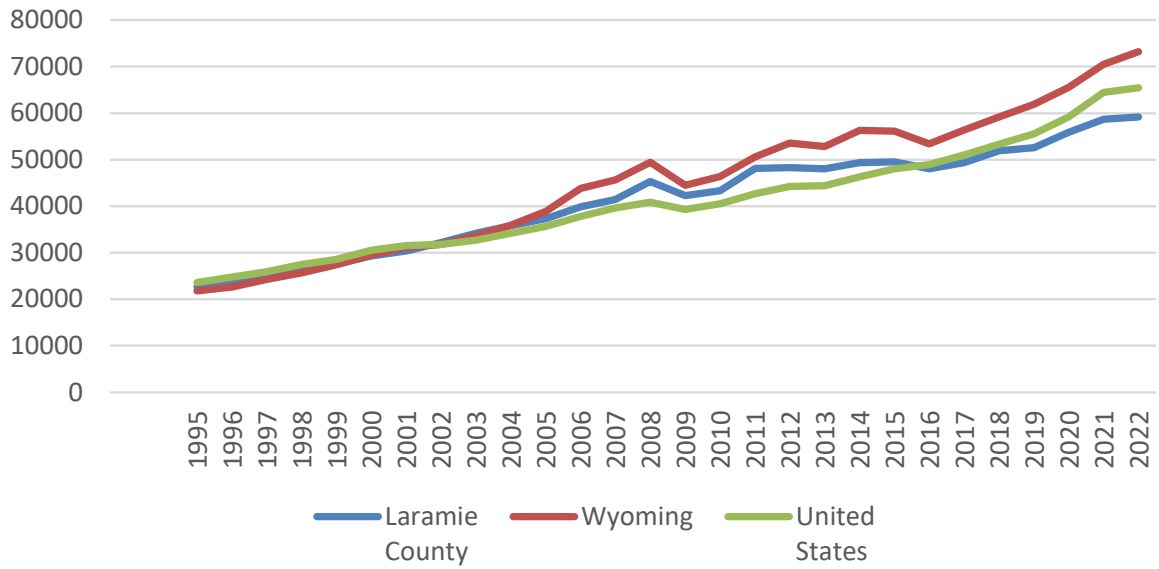

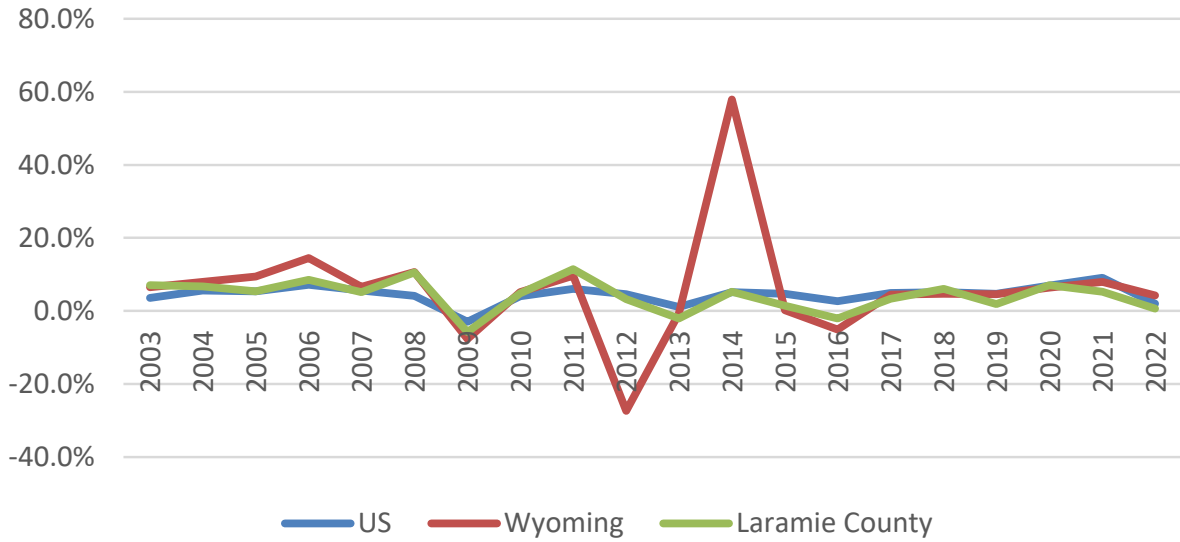

## Demographic Trends

The Demographic Trends section presents population data and population forecasts for both Cheyenne and Laramie County. Table 4.0 presents population details for Census Designated Places as of the 2020 Decennial Census.

- Table 4.1 provides population estimates and projections using US Census data
- Table 4.2 (a) contains data on the age distribution of Laramie County residents. The median age of Laramie County residents was 38.1 in 2022, down from 38.8 in 2021.
- The population 65 years of age and older continued to increase, from 17,183 in 2021 to 17,534 in 2022(+2.0%). The 55 to 64 years age cohort decreased, from 12,890 to 12,472(-3.3%). These two cohorts together accounted for 29.7 percent of the population, evidence of the continued aging of Laramie County's population.
- The number of workers in the prime working age cohort (25 to 44 years) increased from 27,637 in 2021 to 28,229 in 2022, an increase of 2.1 percent.
- Table 4.4 contains migration statistics for Laramie County from 2002 through 2021. For the second time in the last four years, out-migration has exceeded in-migration. In 2020, the net number of migrants, (in-migrants minus out-migrants), was 79. In 2021, the net number was -10. These are the two most balanced years in the last 20 in terms of migration. Normally, we see a net migration of 543 in-migrant minus out-migrants.
- Table 4.5 presents data on the inflow and outflow of earnings and the net resident adjustment between the two. The inflow of earnings is the amount of money brought back into the county's economy by Laramie County residents who commute to work outside of the county. The outflow of earnings represents workers who commute into the county for work, but live outside of the county and take their earnings back to their county of residence. In 2022, \$128,270,000 flowed into the county and \$337,776,000 flowed out of the county, resulting in a net outflow of \$209,506,000. The pattern has been consistent over time – net outflows have been larger than inflows. This means more dollars left the local economy than were returned by Laramie County residents working outside Laramie County. While these may look like large numbers, the net outflow of \$209,506,000 represents only 3.5 percent of total personal income in Laramie County.

- Table 4.6 presents data on the level of education attained by Laramie County residents. In 2022, 95.0 percent of the adult population had graduated from high school and 28.4 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. There is moderate variation in these estimates from one year to the next which makes year-to-year comparisons problematic. Statewide, 93.7 percent of the adult population had graduated from high school and 29.6 had obtained a bachelor's degree or higher. Nationally, 89.6 percent of adults had graduated from high school while 35.7 percent had obtained a Bachelor's degree or higher.<sup>5</sup>
- Table 4.7 contains data on public and private school enrollments within Laramie County. Total public school enrollment (LCSD1 and LSCD2) decreased, from 14,722 in 2022 to 14,409 (-2.2%) in 2023. From 2022 to 2023, all levels of public schooling (Elementary, Junior High, Senior High) saw small decreases in enrollment.
- Table 4.7 also presents Laramie County Community College (LCCC) enrollments. Enrollments at LCCC were pushed down due to the coronavirus pandemic and student preference for in-person learning. In 2023, LCCC continued seeing a bounce back in enrollment. The headcount of students learning in Laramie County is up 4.8 percent from last year and FTE is up 6.9 percent. I expect those numbers to continue to improve.
- Home-schooled enrollments decreased in 2023. This is likely due to students returning to in-person learning. Home-schooled enrollment decreased from 452 in 2022 to 434 in 2023(-3.9%).

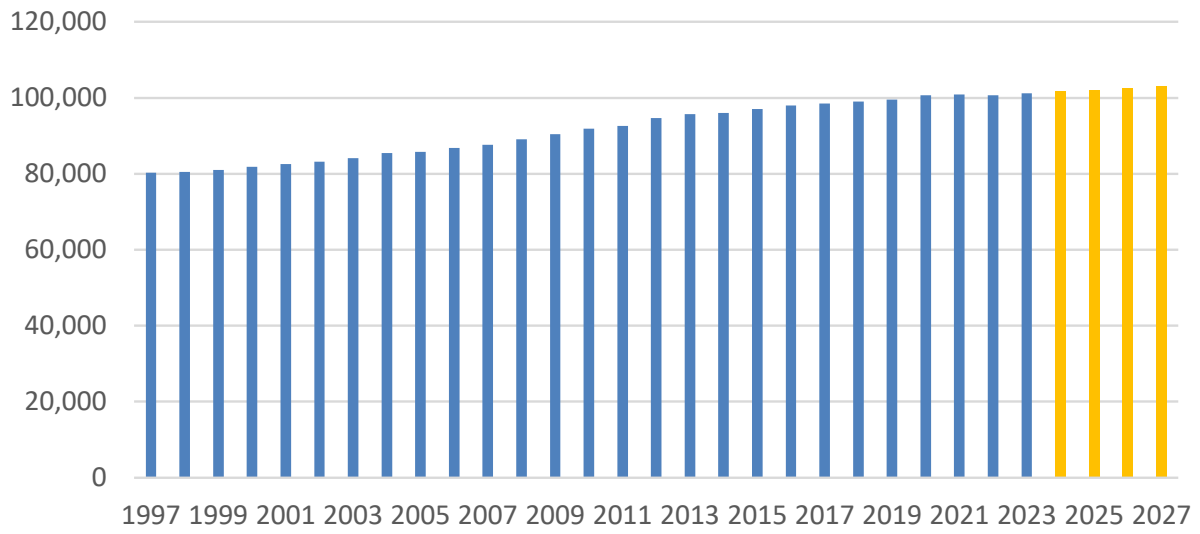

Figure 9. Earnings Flows by Commuters into and out of Laramie County, 1996-2022

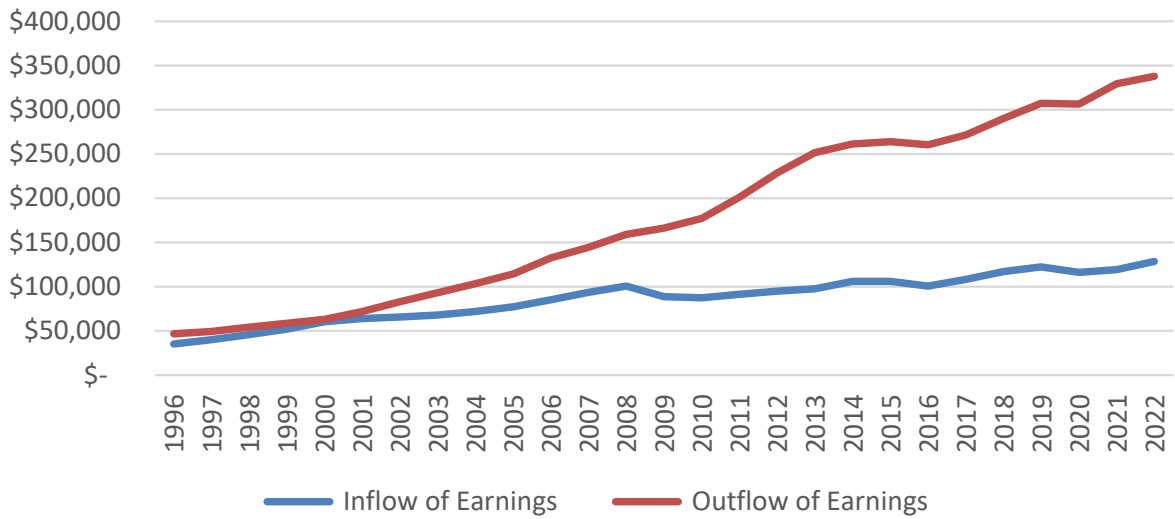
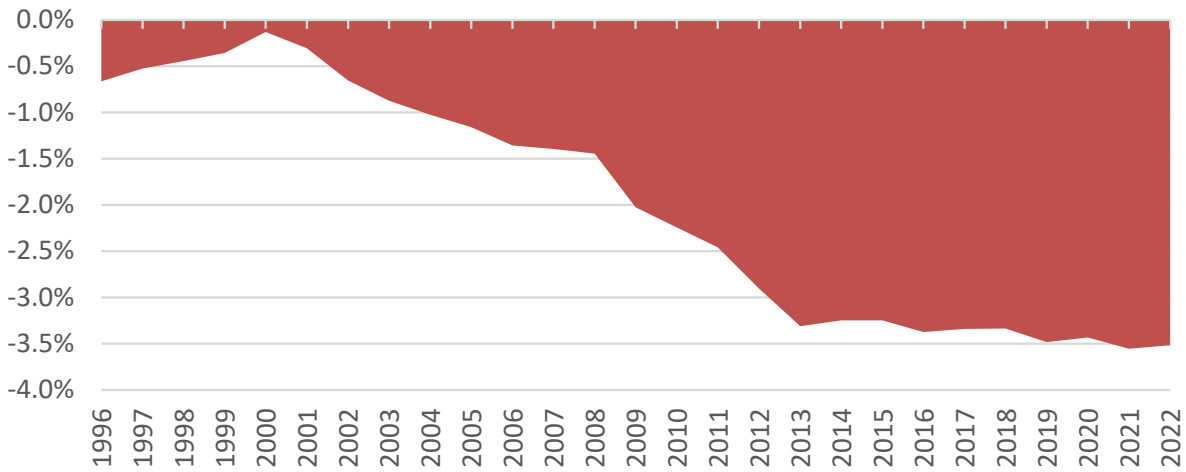


Figure 10. Laramie County Net Residential Adjustment as a Percentage of Total Income, 1996-2022

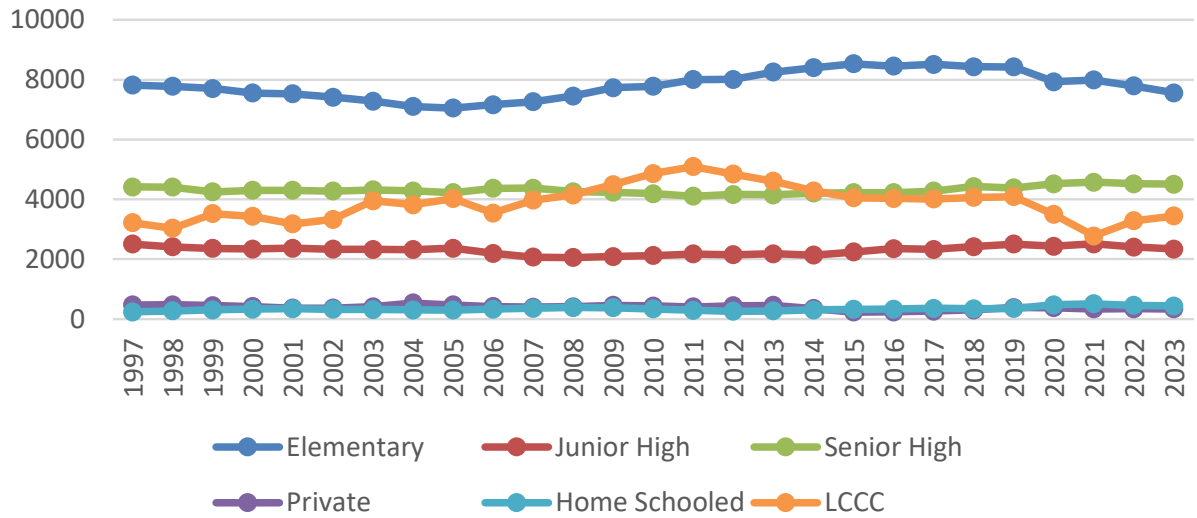

## Housing Trends

The Housing Trends section contains data compiled from various sources that may be useful in assessing the local housing market.

- Table 5.0 presents data obtained from the Cheyenne Board of Realtors. From 2022 to 2023, the average monthly number of residential units available for sale rose from 152 to 189 (+24.3%) in the city of Cheyenne and rose from 85 to 126 (+48.2%) in the county.
- The total number of units – city **and** county -- sold fell from 1,579 in 2022 to 1,264 in 2023 (-19.9%). In the city, the average selling price rose from \$362,147 to \$372,305 (+2.8%) and in the county, the average selling price fell slightly from \$578,303 to \$575,456 (-0.5%)
- Table 5.4 presents data on building permits issued in the city of Cheyenne and Laramie County. In the city, the number of building permits for new single-family homes fell sharply from 212 in 2022 to 67 in 2023 (-68%) and new apartments/duplexes rose from 49 in 2022 to 73 in 2023. In total, these multi-family permits added 140 units. In the county, outside the city of Cheyenne, the number of single-family building permits fell nearly in half, from 160 in 2022 to 85 in 2023 (-47%).
- Housing rental rates in Cheyenne are presented in Table 5.1. Rental rates for single-family homes increased from \$1,587 to \$1,653 (+4.2%) from second quarter 2022 to second quarter 2023. Rental rates for apartments increased from \$1,008 in the second quarter of 2022 to \$1,113 in the second quarter of 2023 (+10.4%).
- Table 5.7 presents apartment vacancy rates in Laramie County. Vacancy rates at large apartment complexes rose from 1.3 percent in the fourth quarter of 2022 to 1.9 percent in the fourth quarter of 2023.

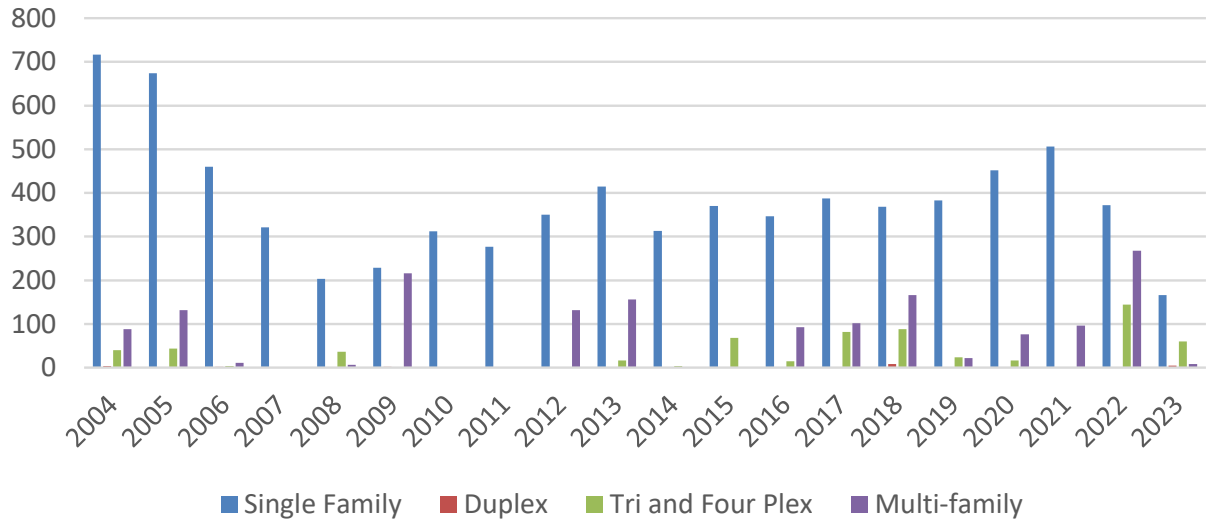

# Development Trends

The Development Trends section presents data on commercial and industrial development in Cheyenne and Laramie County.

- In 2023, the city of Cheyenne annexed 90 acres, which increased the size of the city by 0.4 percent.
- Table 6.1 contains detailed information on the level of commercial construction within the city borders. The total number of permits fell from 153 in 2022 to 118 in 2023 (-22.9%). The total valuation of all permits rose by 171.5 percent. The large increase in permit values is almost entirely due to data center additions being added in 2023.
- The value of new industrial/commercial construction rose in the city and fell in the county in 2023. Total new dollar valuation was \$50.8 million in the city and \$23.0 million in the county. In the city, the Eagle Claw Tackle factory and a senior activity center were the biggest new projects. In the county, a new building for MHC Kenworth was the largest new construction project. See Table 6.2 for details.
- Vacancy statistics for commercial properties are presented in Table 6.3. This table presents quarterly data through the fourth quarter of 2023. The number of available office spaces increased by 3 from 28 in the fourth quarter of 2022 to 31 in the fourth quarter of 2023, while the average rent for office spaces fell by nearly \$2 per square foot.
- The number of vacant warehouse properties increased by 10 over the year, moving from 14 in the fourth quarter of 2022 to 24 in the fourth quarter of 2023. The total available square footage of warehouse space fell by nearly 100,000 sf in 2023. Rents increased nearly \$3 per square foot over the past year.
- The number of available retail properties increased from 40 in the fourth quarter of 2022 to 42 in the fourth quarter of 2023. There are still over a dozen empty storefronts in the Frontier Mall. Rents have increased nearly \$5 per square foot over the last year.
- Data on the assessed value of real and personal property are found in Table 6.4. Combined, property valuation for the city of Cheyenne and Laramie County was \$2.87 billion, an increase of 15.8 percent over 2022. Total city valuation was \$1.05 billion dollars in 2022, an increase of 12.2 percent over 2022 and total county valuation was \$1.82 billion dollars, an increase of 18.0 percent from 2022.
- Every type of real property, except industrial property, saw an increase in value in both the city and in the county.

- Table 6.5 presents property tax revenues generated for various local governmental entities. The city of Cheyenne's property tax revenues rose 12.2 percent from 2022 to 2023. This provided the city with additional revenue of \$920,298. Laramie County's property tax revenues rose 15.8 percent over the same time period, which resulted in an increase of \$7,465,013 in tax revenue.

## Economic Development

- Laramie County's economic development organization, Cheyenne LEADS, reported that it had 25 active projects going into 2024. The primary prospect areas are data centers(6), manufacturing(5), and firearms(4).

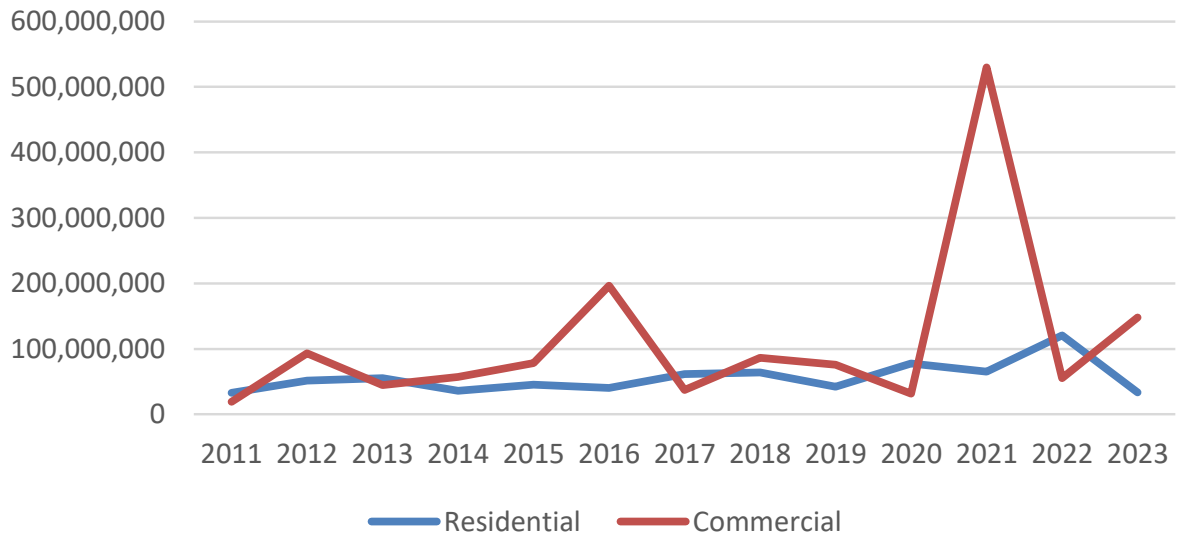

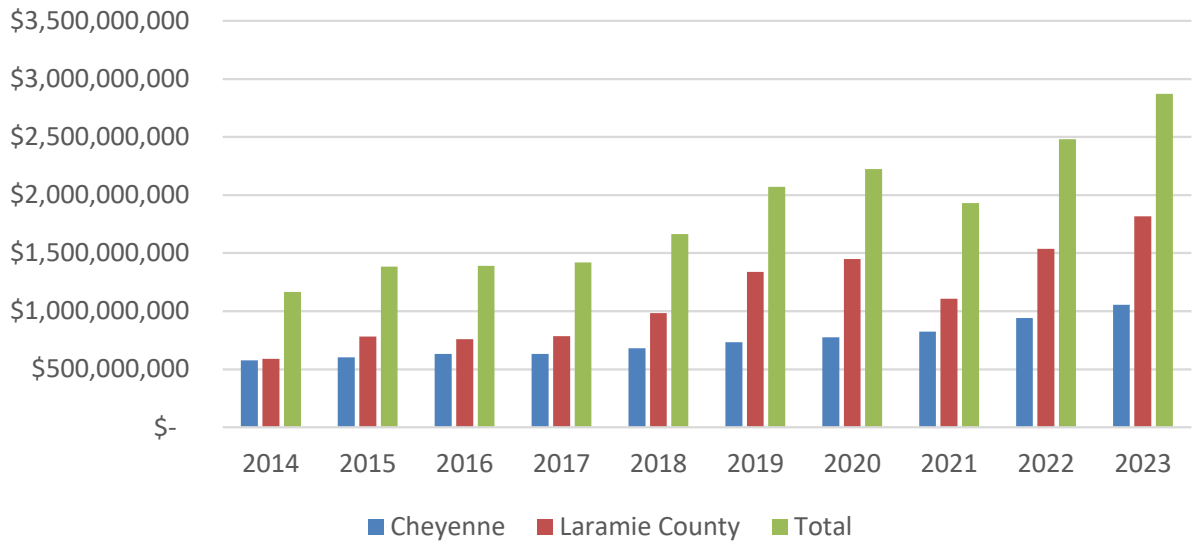
